He Māori Ahau (I am Māori) Whānau Hui

Last Thursday evening we held our He Māori Ahau (I am Māori) Whānau Hui. The hui was a huge success, with ninety people attending. The hui was led by Matua Whaitiri Poutawa and whānau were able see and hear about the programme which allows students to explore their Māoritanga with an emphasis on Hauora (wellbeing) and Tū Pono (identity and knowing oneself). The programme is targeted at young Māori to connect with their Māoritanga and form positive self-identity as Māori within their kura and their challenging world.

Carl McManaway does a great job leading Te Reo Māori in our school and working alongside Matua Whaitiri with the He Māori Ahau roopu.

A very positive by-product of the hui is that twelve names were added to the list of people wanting to commit themselves to our Whānau Roopu, which is made up of a group of interested parents who meet termly to offer our school a Māori perspective as kaitiaki (guardians) for our tauira (students) as they engage with te Ao Māori (the Māori world). Health and Physical Education Community Survey

At Adventure School children are taught about and participate in, many Health and Physical Education programmes and activities. All New Zealand schools are required to survey their community once every two years in relation to Health and P.E. As part of our two-yearly review of the Health curriculum, we ask for your input to help us in ensuring that we are providing programmes and activities that Whanau feel are important in meeting the needs of our students.

There are four sections to this survey - Health, Physical Education, Sexuality Education and other comments. Sexuality Education is a programme taught at Year 7 and 8 level only. We welcome feedback on this from all parents, regardless of whether you have children at these year levels.

A link to the survey will be sent out by email. We invite you to respond by selecting "Not Important", "Important" or "Really Important - Vital for our children to learn" from the drop-down menu for each component of our Health, PE and Sexuality Education programmes.

This survey link can be used to submit results from more than one parent/caregiver in the household. All results will be collated and taken into consideration when planning 2022-2023 programmes. Your selections and comments are anonymous.
