The government has acted swiftly in response to the community cases identified as the Delta variant. While it seems that the virus has not travelled beyond Auckland at this stage, there is no telling how many close contacts have travelled around the country since August 12th when the carrier was infectious. For this reason I am expecting the lockdown to extend beyond the three days.

I have set no expectation work will be sent home over the initial three days. This is to give everyone time to adjust to the new situation and get their families organised without adding any additional stress. 


There have been a number of serious near misses caused by children and adults crossing the road in Longitude Place.


