From our Principal

The first five weeks of term have disappeared into the ether and we now have just under four weeks of the year left. So much of our time has been spent discussing Ministry directives and trying to implement the litany of confusing and contradictory Ministry guidelines and PHO's, that I have endeavoured to make the focus of this, penultimate newsletter, non-Covid.

Respect for Students

We have a great staff at Adventure School. People who understand that respect is a two-way street and that respect has to be earned not expected. Perhaps the most powerful attribute a teacher can exhibit, is respect for students. This is a little different from aspiring to be respected oneself. Often people who seek respect don't quite get it. As a teacher, I can think of none, however, who have worked consistently to be respectful of students, who did not ultimately gain reciprocal respect and also the respect of parents and colleagues.

Respecting students' means respecting them with special attention, to honouring them, showing consideration toward them, being concerned about them, appreciating them, relating to them, admiring their strengths, and caring for them and at the same time maintaining boundaries and providing appropriate guidance in a variety of contexts. Young people are dignified and strengthened by adult respect. The absence of such respect is corrosive. Respect for students is rooted in teachers' beliefs and manifest in words and actions.

Staff who respect students understand the power of beliefs in shaping their practice and purging any persuasion they may have that kids who are like them in race, economic status, language, beliefs, or motivation are somehow better or smarter than those who are unlike them. They believe their work can make previously struggling students shine—and can raise the ceilings of possibility for all students regardless of economic status or cultural background. They teach students how to grow academically and personally and they enlist students' partnership in creating a classroom that dignifies each person. I believe sincerely that these are the people we have at Adventure School.

Great Teachers

It would be easy for teachers to wilt under the burden of planning, teaching, behaviour management, compliance, analysis, review and reporting. At Adventure School we try to maintain a sensible, realistic and sustainable workload - with a minimum of unnecessary naval gazing experiences - that recognises the importance of work / life balance.

I want to acknowledge our staff for putting time into the "fun stuff" and staying true to our vision of "The Adventure Way", and of the holistic education that does create extra work but is so important in providing challenging and exciting experiences, in and out of the classroom for our children.

Support Staff

How lucky are we to have the quality of professionals we do, that manage our business and administration and Teacher Aide areas. The hard work that goes on in these areas can sometimes fly under the radar. The expert management of finances and office administration and the excellence and empathy our teacher aides devote to our students and teaching staff is such a critical factor in making our school work. The reality is, without this work the jobs of school leaders and teachers would be unmanageable.

Mikaele

Mikaele our wonderful caretaker, handyman, fixit man. Mikaele is another staff member who will go over and above the call of duty to help staff. He will often drop what he is doing to help teachers with things like constructing furniture or moving stuff.

Mikaele has had a tough time emotionally in the last few weeks. He has lost two family members recently so our thoughts are very much with him and his extended family.
