# From our Principal

If the year starts with a bad joke, it can only get better.

I must say at the outset that it has been a very positive first week of school. I want to thank parents for adhering to our protocols around school entry and exit. This is an overt expression of your support for the school. I know that mask wearing is a new situation for us all and again, I want to thank you for your diligence in supporting this government mandate.

I am well aware of the fact that it is the efforts of parents in the home - stressing the important role masks play in keeping us safe and keeping the school open - that has seen such a positive response. By the same token we recognise that some children are not able to wear masks - for a variety of reasons - and that is ok.

During the week, teachers' / syndicates will have made an effort to contact parents with some form of introductory communication. Our face to face "Meet the Teacher" evening is not until week four (Thursday 3rd March (5pm - 7pm) so it will be nice to receive some form of communication prior to then.

There is a reality though, around the presence of Omicron in our community and we are not expecting to be able to carry on, unaffected, ad infinitum. Some schools have already been impacted by infections and have struggled to stay open. Many will ultimately close for a period of time. We will need to be prepared for a number of scenarios so syndicates are preparing by gathering material to be able to sustain distance learning when required and when appropriate.

The three main scenarios we face are:

- School operating at full capacity
- School operating at reduced capacity with a number of staff and students isolating or unwell
- School closed with distance learning facilitated by those who are not unwell or recovering

Teachers will need to consider their personal circumstance and respond appropriately:

- Teachers are well, at school, teaching under normal circumstances or with reduced staff and students
- Teachers are well but isolating and therefore able to support distance learning from home
- Teachers unwell, isolating and recovering so will not be teaching in either platform until they are well

School closure will be a last resort option. Health and safety will be the major factor that will determine this decision. Health and safety factors that would influence closure:

- The ability to sustain teaching and learning with a manageable teacher pupil ratio
- Having enough teachers onsite with current first aid certificates
- Cleaning services able to carry on

The school has a Covid plan and the Board will make the critical decisions after taking advice from the Ministry, should situations around infection occur. Anyway, enough of Covid, Omicron, infection, isolation and any other plague related language; let's enjoy the good times while we have them.

A shout out to Tania Cox for being the inspiration behind our wonderful new school sign. A truly magnificent expression of who we are and what the "Adventure Way" means to us.

A huge thanks also to the Abaniel family (Speedy Signs) for very generously creating, erecting and donating the sign.

School bucket hats are available for purchase from the office for \$13.


