## Curriculum

Our main topic of inquiry will look at celebrations and commemorations, both in New Zealand and around the world. This lends itself to writing information reports as well as honing skills in reading and analysing nonfiction text. The topic also marries nicely with our formal dance practice this term and our biennial senior ball to be held early in term three. Artistic endeavours will centre on decorations for the Ball. The theme will be Venetian Masquerade; students will be making their own masks towards the latter part of the term.

Our maths focus will move from algebraic thinking to geometry, although we will continue to reinforce number knowledge and strategy. We are continuing with our languages programme and students will swap into either german, french, spanish or sign language. Technicraft starts up again this Thursday, please remember it is an earlier start on those days - your child needs to be at school by 8.30am, so that we can take the roll and get onto the buses.

Cross country training has already started and we ask that students bring suitable footwear for running on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. The school-wide cross country event is scheduled to take place on Friday of Week 4.
