KIVA SURVEY DATA

We are proud to be a KiVa school.

KiVa is an evidence-based program designed to prevent bullying and to tackle cases of bullying effectively.

As a KiVa school, we are committed to actively following the KiVa programme and promoting anti-bullying.

To track levels of bullying and also guide further planning and learning, children from years 3-8 take part in an anonymous online survey every November.

The tables below show the tracking of cohort survey results since beginning the programme.

The Wonder Rocket Challenge




We are very curious and collaborative Adventurers!

We explored health and safety, making sure everything we did complied with the health and safety standards.








As you can see, we have a lot of fun testing variables, designing prototypes and of course, flying our rockets.

NZ Garden Bird Survey – 25 June to 3 July

The survey is an annual citizen science project organised by Manaaki Whenua – Landcare Research. It takes place over nine days between 25 June and 3 July this year. People count the birds they see in their back gardens, a school, park or marae.

Here's how people can get involved

- 1. Visit the NZ Garden Bird Survey website to get started.
- 2. Select a garden, or a local park, school grounds, or marae.
- 3. Choose any ONE day between 25 June and 3 July.
- 4. Look and listen for birds on that day for ONE hour.
- 5. For each species, record the HIGHEST number seen or heard at one time.
- 6. Submit the results online at the NZ Garden Bird Survey website.
- Contribute to the conversation #NZGardenBirdSurvey
