Covid 19

We seem to be experiencing a small resurgence of Covid cases among staff. While we have no new staff infections, we have a number of staff isolating as close contacts. There are reports of another rather serious (non-Covid) bug doing the rounds, so the winter lurgies are starting to surface.

If a second wave arrives, we intend to carry on in the same way as we did during the first wave. That is, we will use available relievers and senior managers to cover classrooms or teaching sessions. We will set programmes within syndicates that can be covered by a reduced number of mobile staff. If necessary, we will split classes and use DVD medium, if that helps the reduced staffing cover a larger than normal group of students.

What we will try to avoid at all costs is to ask classes or year groups to stay home because of teacher shortages. We have avoided any level of school closure to date and we intend carry on in that vein.

Creepy Creature


