

Full STEM Ahead!

Totara has been concentrating on STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) subjects over the course of Term 3. We had a particular focus on the science and mechanics behind simple machines, with students working collaboratively on the construction of catapults, trebuchets and castles. This tied in nicely with a trip to the Science Roadshow at Brandon Intermediate where we looked at and experimented with all manner of contraptions and displays.

This term has been pretty educational, but also fun at the same time! We have been very focused, learning all about Simple Machines, and I love it! 
science Roadshow
