


Lost Property

Adventure School Cubs Colourful Touch Jam Festival

On Rāhoroi 19th November 2022 the Adventure School Cubs touch team participated in the third annual Touch Jam Festival at Hutt Park.

The Cubs were made up of year whā (4) boys & girls, whom touch is not their main activity, and for some it was their first time playing the sport; it was a great opportunity for them to play one of Aotearoa's largest participation sports.

The Cubs were well supported by friends and whānau who kept the kids fed and energised with their side line cheering.

It was a wet start to the day, but credit to the organisers for not cancelling, and to the kids (and supporters!) for not blinking an eye lid at the weather conditions. As it turned out playing in the rain is a lot of fun, and by the end of the day the ground was bathed in sunshine!

The Cubs played against several different kura, including Fernlea (Wainuiomata), Naenae and a school all the way from Turangi! Although scores aren't recorded, the Cubs were competitive and managed four 'wins', with everyone contributing to the success of the team, with a few of the kids scoring their first ever touch try!

The highlights were how they learned and applied the rules of touch after only having a couple of 'training' sessions, and how they played as a team, all the while encouraging each other. The most pleasing aspect was their relentlessness in defence, running themselves to a standstill each game.

The Cubs made the school proud by displaying the Adventure Way, with sportspersonship at the forefront of the Cubs play.

The Touch Jam organisers made it a super fun day for the tamariki, which included entry to Junglerama, team games, water activities and the famous 'colour run'.
