Kia ora and welcome back to school!

Tania, Nadine and I have had a great start to the Term! We are taking the time now to get to know our new tamariki and for them to get to know us.

The first few weeks are about establishing routines in each classroom, and beginning to establish the routines and expectations of our three-class collaboration. Once established, our collaboration will run from 10.50am-1pm every day of the week. During this time, we will have one teacher in the Play, while the other two teachers are teaching small literacy or mathematics groups in a quiet space. Teaching and learning in this way means that we are able to keep learning groups smaller and be more targeted to individual goals. It also means that we always have kaiako available to tamariki during Learning Through Play sessions to provide social and emotional coaching, grow the Adventure Way traits and build New Zealand Curriculum Knowledge in tamariki.

Note: We were very much looking forward to seeing you at our Meet and Greet evening on Thursday this week, but as Rebecca and Nadine are away with Covid, we will need to reschedule. We will come back to you with an alternative date soon.

Roll Growth

Our Room 8, 9 and 12 classes are filling up quickly, and we are incredibly lucky to have Di Henzell join us again in Term 2 to start a roll growth class made up of Year 0 and 1 children. In the coming weeks, there will be a small number of children starting in Room 8, 9 and 12 who will move through to Di's class at the start of Term 2. This allows us to maintain lower numbers in all our classes.

Some of you may recall that Di started a roll growth class last year in Term 3, and she comes to us with many years experience. Di will be running preschool sessions this term. We are looking forward to having her back in Kowhai Syndicate.




We are excited to announce that we have purchased Reading Eggs subscriptions for our Year 1 students for 2023. We were able to do this with the whānau ICT donations.

Foundation Skills - Movement

Quite often both preschool teachers and primary teachers are asked: what can I do to help my child be "ready for school". Of course, we take every child from wherever they are when they start school. Recently the Kowhai team read the book; Ready 4 Learning - Ready 4 Life by Vince Ford, Andrea Ford and Carolynne Masson, who are New Zealand authors. According to these authors, there are 5 areas of foundation skills; movement, seeing, speaking, hearing and print concepts, though they are often called different things in different books/research.



Though Learning Through Play supports the growth of children's movement skills, it is important for children to have these skills prior to attending school. We wanted to take this opportunity to share a small snippet from this book as we thought it could be helpful to support building the movement foundation skill.

"Encourage physical movement and risk-taking, get children making huts, climbing trees and rocks, and swinging and hanging on the monkey bars. Challenge them on walking beams and practice marching, skipping and running. The only motor skill you'll encounter in front of a screen is swiping".
