It's been a somewhat unsettling week for many of our staff and families as we receive ongoing updates of the devastation caused by Cyclone Gabrielle.

Our hearts go out to the many families further north who have been hugely affected.

Thankfully (at this stage), our region seems to have missed the brunt of the Cyclone and only a small number of schools and kura have been adversely affected to date.

I just want to reassure you we have a plan to keep your children safe should an emergency event require the school to close during the day.

You will be notified via:

- School-links (text message) - Email - Syndicate Facebook - School Website

We have a plan in place that includes staff staying with children not able to be picked up immediately and Civil Defence Supplies to keep us fed and warm if we need to remain at school for an extended period of time.

This is probably a timely reminder to update your child's emergency contact details as students would only be released to nominated people.

Of course, we're all hoping we never have to implement this plan!











IMPORTANT SAFETY REMINDER
