Kōwhai Syndicate

Ever wondered why 5-year-olds are exhausted when they make it home from school?

Introducing: A day in the life of a Kōwhai student...



<u>8.30 - 8.55am</u>

Tamariki arrive at school and hang their bags up. This is a time for children to catch up with their teacher and classmates.

<u>8.55am - 9.15am</u>

Mat Hui: From 8.55am all children join their classmates and teacher for a mat time hui which can involve start of the day routines, karakia and a whole class literacy learning session.





<u>9.15 - 10.30am</u>

Children engage in Learning Through Play while the teacher calls small groups of children to the 'jelly bean' table for literacy learning.







<u>10.30am - 10.50am</u> Morning tea - during the warmer months, children sit with their friends under the shade cloth to eat their kai before heading off to play.



<u> 10.50am - 11.50am</u>

The first 'In the Play Teacher' runs the mat time and promotes the NZ Curriculum or Adventure Way traits. Sometimes we have special visitors from around the school to share and teach us new things.





After the mat time, it is back into the Play and the "Teaching Teachers" call small groups of children for mathematics and literacy learning. We use Room 8 as the teaching only room, and Room 12 and under the shade cloth is for Learning Through Play. We are slowly opening up Room 9 to be available as our quiet space for children.

















<u> 11.50am - 12.00 noon</u>

During Brain Break, children bring their lunch boxes down to the mat. The 'In the Play Teacher' shares photos of what was happening in the play for today's session. We often encourage children to share things they have been working on, and we also use real life situations to discuss and reflect on and grow the Adventure Way.



<u> 12.00 noon - 12.40pm</u>

We are back in the Play once again, and the second 'In the Play Teacher' takes over so that the first 'In the Play Teacher' can take mathematics and literacy learning groups.



12.40pm - 1.00pm

At the end of our session, we must reset our spaces. The children work in teams to tidy specific spaces across our learning environment.





<u> 1.00pm - 1.55pm</u>

After all that fun and learning, the children are hungry for their kai! We monitor the children while they eat their lunch from 1.00-1.10pm and ensure they eat a 'good amount' before heading off to play.



1.55pm-3.00pm

Every day after lunch starts off with reading books, and then we move into our afternoon literacy mat time.

Our afternoons in Kōwhai are the most varied part of the day. After our literacy mat time, our afternoons are made up of physical education sessions, buddy class time, library, assemblies, the Arts lessons, or preschool (where applicable).



And there you have it: A day in the life of a Kowhai student!
