### **BOARD OF TRUSTEES MID-TERM ELECTION**

Later this year, the Adventure School community will vote to elect three parent representatives for the Board of Trustees. We thought this would be a good opportunity to give you some information about the board and what being a representative involves.

Being a board member is a wonderful opportunity to help shape outcomes for our tamariki/children and kaimahi (staff).

- The board is made up of six parent representatives, the principal, and an elected staff representative. The board is responsible for governing all aspects of the school. An overview of the board functions can be found <u>here</u>.
- Adventure School's board meets for around three hours each month and communicates regularly outside of meetings. Board members also do some work outside of the meetings.
- Adventure School opts for mid-term elections which are held 18 months after the triennial election. This allows the board to have continuity.

The board needs a diverse range of skills and experiences to function at its best and be an effective team. Being on the board is also a chance for personal development. You don't need to have previous governance experience to be part of an effective board. Board members are supported with training and guidance to make sure that everyone understands the responsibilities of the role.









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
Adventure School provides an inclusive environment for my child(ren).




My child(ren)'s cultural identity is recognised and valued at Adventure School.




Adventure School has a cultural responsive approach to Te Ao Māori and Te Tiriti o Waitangi (The Treaty of Waitangi).




Adventure School is growing my child(ren)'s digital technology capabilities.




Adventure School's buildings and grounds are modern and attractive.
