Kowhai Syndicate - Making Models

During our Self-Directed Learning time, Kōwhai teachers have been growing Curiosity by introducing new curriculum content and activities and encouraging children to be open to these new ideas. The children have been learning about how to build models of things around us. It all started when Mrs St. Clair showed Kōwhai a model of a space station she built from materials around the classroom. It didn't take long for tamariki to take up the challenge of building their own rockets, space shuttles and space stations. The children already had a lot of prior knowledge from our previous writing focus on space.





We quickly discovered that every good space rocket NEEDS a parachute (how else will it make it back safely to Earth?!). Mrs Amorangi modelled how to make a parachute so that children could attach these to already existing rockets.



To our delight, we heard through the grapevine that Mrs Willis' class have also been building models. We were so excited to have them come and show off their amazing golf course and it has certainly inspired our younger students to learn from our more experienced Rimu tuakana. The Kōwhai students quickly jumped to the challenge of making a 'mega' model in collaboration with their peers.
