Health & Physical Education Community Survey Findings and Analysis - 2023


Thank you to the families who took part in this survey – there were an outstanding 187 surveys completed!

Although many comments were stand alone, please be assured all information is valued and will be considered. Comments that had a familiar thread with more than 5 responses have been shared below.


HEALTH PROGRAMMES (27 comments overall)

 There were several comments with opposing views around Sexuality Education, being taught in schools, particularly for Yrs 7 & 8.




PHYSICAL ACTIVITY (28 comments overall)

- Most deemed physical activity important
- A few people thought Athletics / Cross Country should be optional
- Some would like to see more interschool and other sporting opportunities offered



EOTC PROGRAMMES (25 comments overall)

- Many commented EOTC was valuable in giving children opportunities to connect, experience new activities, grow independence and resilience.
- Family Fun Days are a challenge for working parents to join in.

The information received has been valuable and will contribute to informing future planning and resourcing for Health and Physical Education.

Please be assured, we **do not** teach Sex Education in Primary School.

We **do** focus on Relationships and at Year 7 & 8, "Changes at Puberty". We will be reviewing the content of this programme ahead of it being taught in Term 4.

In Year 5 & 6 the children lightly touch on some changes at puberty, with the girls learning about periods.

The PTNi appreciates the school community and wider community support over the past years as fundraising efforts have increased to help raise funds to contribute to the new senior playground. The PTNi has a number of fundraising activities planned for 2024 to help us achieve the \$32,000 we have remaining on our playground contribution.

We are excited to be running the Adventure School Duathlon on Friday 22nd March.

Prior to COVID, the PTNI successfully ran a Duathlon every second year, with the last one in 2019. The event is a major fundraiser and funds raised will help to cover the PTNI's contribution to the Senior Playground. The event is a fun challenge for all abilities and gives children a sense of achievement.

How it works:

Each entrant collects individual sponsorship prior to the event and records details on the attached sponsorship form. Entrants then collect the sponsorship money after the event.

There will be a major prize of a new bike for the student that raises the most sponsorship funds. There will also be spot prizes on the day. All entrants will receive a finisher ribbon when they cross the line.

On the day:

Entrants will assemble on the top field at 4.30pm, ready for a 5pm start. Races will be in year groups.

All events are run within the school grounds. There will be a sausage sizzle and bake stall.

How to enter:

Entry is via kindo.

Entry is \$15 for an individual entry. As we will need a number of helpers for this event, entry is reduced to \$10 for an individual entry if a parent/caregiver commits to helping. Help is needed to set up on the Friday (either 9am-12pm or 1-4pm), pack down, help around the course at the event, MC, take photos, help with bike mechanics, do baking etc). We will make sure you don't miss your child's race if you help at the event.

Entry fees are capped at \$30 per family.

Event Sponsorship:

We are on the lookout for sponsors for our prizes and costs for the event. There are a number of options such as, naming sponsor for race bibs, sponsoring ribbons and specific prizes, donating goods or services for spot prizes, or cash donations. Please contact us if you're keen.
