St John's at Adventure



Learning how to call for help in an emergency is such an important life skill, certainly one that we hope to never have to use of course! In Rimu, our students have been working with the fantastic and incredibly passionate Jel from St John's.

We learnt about what to do if we are the first to respond to an emergency and how to assess a patient using the DRSAB (leaving out the C which is around delivering CPR). Jel went through calling 111 in the event of an emergency and how to roll someone on their side into the safe side position (previously known as the recovery position).

Finally, we ended our time with Jel learning about what to do if someone was choking and how to treat burns. The light-hearted approach to such a serious subject went down so well with our students. Thank you Jel, for your knowledge and expertise in this area as well as your ability to completely capture a class of students like it was a theatrical performance!







Local Histories- Blake NZ: VR Experience



Wearing a VR headset, students experienced a number of underwater experiences through 360° videos that compared and contrasted different marine environments. They learnt what causes ocean damage and what actions can be taken to protect the marine environment. Students came away from the session with a deeper understanding of kaitiakitanga and practical actions they can take to help protect the environment. With a handful of students, as well as a teacher, feeling a tad "sea sick" (motion sickness) the experience created some brilliant discussion and connected beautifully to our learning about our local history.
