With Term One now firmly behind us, I reflect back on eleven weeks of learning experiences. Not least of these was our senior camp at Makahika Outdoor Pursuits Centre. Thank you to everyone who made this possible. It was a welcome change to spend four days in the foothills of the Tararuas without the threat of a global pandemic swirling around us.

Term Two will pick up where Term One left off, with a raft of new and challenging experiences for our ākonga. The following newsletter touches on these, as well as a few other admin matters.

## Learning Experiences

Our main topic of inquiry will focus on the upcoming Olympics. The unit of work is titled "Chasing Greatness". We will be considering the broader history of the games, looking at the science of sports and also folding in aspects of our maths focus on Measurement. We will continue to hold maths workshops on Mondays and Tuesdays that focus specifically on Number.

Students will be pursuing their own notions of greatness with cross-country training in the first four weeks of the term. We ask that students consider their choice of footwear in this pursuit and come to school with shoes that are appropriate for running on Tuesdays and Fridays.

Language rotations continue this term, with students offered a taster in Spanish, French, German or Japanese. There are also opportunities to participate in Kapa Haka and Mr Dalton's Poly Club, though the highlight of the Term will surely be our biennial Formal Dance in Week 10. Students have begun practicing various traditional dances. You will likely soon register your child wanting to discuss the differences between a Hinky Dinky and a Dashing White Sergeant.
