Kia ora e te whānau

We were delighted to have over 120 parents attend our Katherine Berkett evening on "Raising Resilient Children". The feedback has been tremendous!

Kathryn emphasised the importance of building resilience in children by allowing them to experience "tolerable stress." This is something we are actively focusing on at school, especially when it comes to navigating friendship conflicts and taking on new or challenging tasks.

As teachers and parents, we play a key role in helping children develop tolerable stress in a way that builds resilience. By introducing manageable challenges in a supportive environment, we can help our children learn to cope, adapt, and grow stronger. This could be giving them tasks that stretch their abilities without overwhelming them, encouraging problem-solving, and offering guidance when needed.

The aim is to help children face stress in a healthy way, allowing them to build confidence in their ability to overcome difficulties. Over time, this process teaches them how to handle future life challenges, fostering resilience and emotional strength.

Curriculum Update - The Refreshed New Zealand Curriculum

You may have seen or heard discussions in the media recently about the refreshed curriculum and new approaches to teaching. We are pleased to share that, based on the work we had already done, the transition has been a natural progression and has strengthened our foundation for future progress.



We do feel fortunate to have made significant shifts in our teaching practices over the past few years that are reflected in the direction of the refreshed curriculum. These changes have been driven by our ongoing commitment to meeting the needs of our students, grounded in current research. Moving forward, a key focus for our teachers will be adjusting to the now increased expectations at each year level.

Last week, our teachers had a productive day unpacking the refreshed Mathematics and Statistics Curriculum. Maths continues to be a strength across the school; our students are showing strong progress, and our teachers have deep knowledge and capability in this area. Our workshop facilitator recognised the great strides already made. This workshop built on previous professional learning and provided valuable time to reflect and plan. We're looking forward to our next Curriculum Day on the Tuesday after King's Birthday Weekend. Your ongoing support is greatly appreciated, and we look forward to sharing more updates as we continue this journey.

One of our concerns is we have not yet been provided with assessment tools aligned with the refreshed curriculum. Our teachers will continue to closely observe your children to determine what they understand, know and can do, then set next steps. However, we are not yet able to provide detailed information on their achievement levels. This requires an embedded knowledge of the new progress outcomes at each year level and aligned assessment tools, which are yet to be released.

Learning Conversations - 2 & 3 April



At our upcoming learning conversations, the focus will be on strengthening the partnership between home and school. Teachers will share how your child has settled into the new school year, highlighting their strengths and the connections they've made. They will then explore the "Self-Directed" Adventurer trait, with both students and teachers reflecting on their growth, and teachers explaining how this trait is being nurtured. Finally, your child's current learning goals in Reading, Writing, and Maths will be shared, along with strategies to support their progress at home. This is a chance to work together in supporting your child's success.

Ever wondered why your child is exhausted when they come home from school?

Introducing: A day in the life of a Kowhai student...

8.55am - 9.10am

All children participate in a mat time hui which can involve te reo, karakia and waiata.



9.10-9.30am

We launch into a literacy mat time which involves handwriting, phonics and spelling.





9.30 - 10.30am

Children engage in both teacher-directed and student-led activities of literacy (Year 0-1) and mathematics (Year 2). During this time, the teacher calls small groups of children to the 'jellybean' table for learning.

10.25am - 10.50am

Morning tea - children eat their kai before heading off to outside play.

10.50am - 1.00pm



In Year 0-1, children begin their Learning Through Play collaboration time, where teachers promote and coach targeted areas of our Adventure Way traits. During this time, teachers take small groups of children for mathematics learning. In Year 2, children participate in both teacher- directed and student-led literacy activities while the teacher takes small literacy groups. This is also when Year 2 students take part in independent writing.

1.00pm - 1.55pm

Lunch Time - After all that fun and learning, the children are hungry for their kai! We monitor the children while they eat their lunch from 1.00-1.10pm and ensure they eat a 'good amount' before heading off to outdoor play.

1.55pm-3.00pm

Our afternoons in Kōwhai are the most varied part of the day. Our afternoons are made up of physical education (PE), buddy class time, library, assembly, the Arts, or preschool visitors (where applicable). We have also started a buddy reading system with Rimu Syndicate, where big buddies come and listen to little buddies.

And there you have it: A day in the life of a Kowhai student!






