

Interim Reports – Learning Conversations

Report Sharing and Learning Conversations will take place in Term 3.

You will be aware that teachers are currently working through a period of change as the refreshed New Zealand Curriculum is being implemented. At Adventure, we are fortunate that many of the concepts and approaches are already well embedded in our practice.

Our teachers are currently focusing on deepening their knowledge of the extensive content in Mathematics and Literacy for each year level.

Please note that the Year 7/8 Refreshed Curriculum for English is still in draft and won't be available for implementation until 2026. As a result, reporting in literacy for our Tōtara Syndicate will continue to be based on the old curriculum this year.

We remain committed to providing high-quality learning opportunities and clear reporting that reflects each child's progress and next steps. To support this, we have taken the necessary time to carefully navigate the refreshed curriculum and align our reporting through HERO.



SPACE INQUIRY


