We are delighted to have Wilmeri Olivier, our fabulous Librarian, join our Teacher Aide team to support some of our ESoL children.

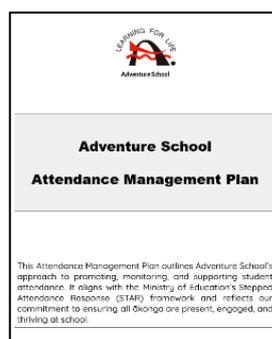
## Adventure School Attendance Management Plan

## Our Approach to Managing Behaviours

At Adventure, our goal is to ensure every student feels safe, included, and ready to learn. As we move into the year, we want to share how we define and handle behaviours, including bullying.

### Our Approach

The foundation of our behaviour plan is growing our Adventure Way trait of **Self-Awareness**. We want students to understand the impact of their words and actions. We focus on four key rights for everyone in our school:

- To feel **safe**.
- To be treated with **dignity and respect**.
- To **teach and learn** without interruption.
- To have **cultural heritage** and **differences** valued.

### Positive Reinforcement

We believe in "pouncing on the positive", with the ultimate aim of building intrinsic motivation - helping children do the right thing because it's the right thing to do, not just for a reward.

### Responding to Behaviours

When students make mistakes, we focus on **accountability**. We use "natural consequences" where possible (e.g., spending time tidying up an area if they caused a mess).

The school uses a consistent "stepped" approach:

Escalation Ladder		
Level	Managed By	Typical Actions
<b>Minor / One-off</b>	Classroom Teacher	Conversations/coaching, "Think Sheets" or apologies.
<b>Repeated / Significant</b>	Team Leader	Behaviour plans, time in Te Whare Ata (see below), and contacting parents.
<b>Complex / Concerning</b>	Deputy Principal	Formal meetings with parents and potential support from outside agencies.
<b>Serious / Unresolved</b>	Principal	Collaborative plans or Ministry of Education processes (e.g., stand-downs).

### Te Whare Ata (A Place of Reflection)

For more significant incidents, students may spend time in **Te Whare Ata**. This is a supervised space for any of the following:

- **Reflection & Coaching:** Talking with one of our Deputy Principals about what happened and how to make a better choice next time.
- **Service:** Giving back to the school (e.g. gardening or tidying) to repair the harm caused.
- **Putting things right:** restoring relationships.

## Addressing Bullying

Adventure School takes bullying very seriously. We follow the **Bullying Free NZ** guidelines and have a dedicated **Kia Māia (Be Brave) Team** to handle these cases.

### What defines Bullying?

It is important to distinguish between social conflict and bullying. Bullying is:

1. **Deliberate** (intended to cause harm).  
&
2. **Repeated** (happens over and over).  
&
3. **Targeted** (aimed at someone with less power).

*Bullying is not a one-off argument, a misunderstanding, or a physical fight between equals.*

### The Kia Māia Process

If bullying is suspected or reported:

- **Investigation:** Staff fill out a formal report; the Kia Māia team (Deputy Principals) investigates thoroughly.
- **Communication:** When a bullying incident is identified, we contact the parents of both the student involved and the student affected.
- **Follow-up:** To ensure the situation has improved we check in with the students and the parents of the child affected.

### Encouraging our Children to be Upstanders

We are teaching our Tamariki that being an "Upstander" is one of the most powerful things they can do.

This means:

- Supporting the person being bullied.
- Safely discouraging the bullying behaviour.
- Reporting the incident to a trusted teacher or staff member

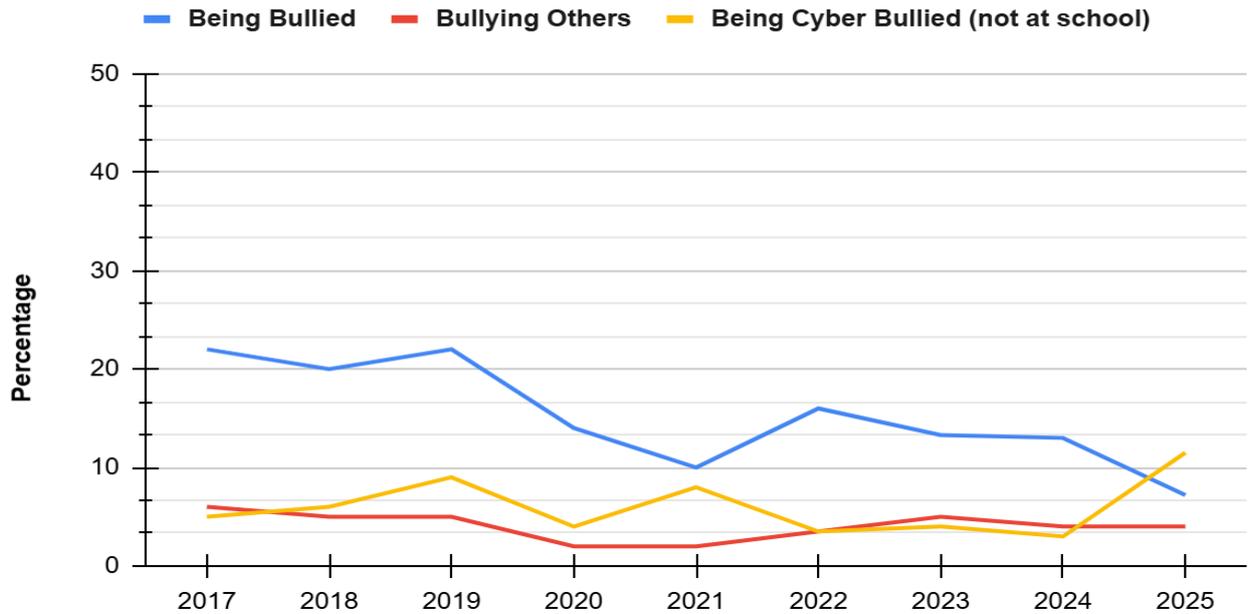
### 2025 Student Survey Results on Bullying

At the end of each year, we carry out a formal survey to gather information on bullying experiences from our Year 3-8 students. This gives our Tamariki a voice and provides us with vital information on their experiences with bullying, helping us better support them in the coming year.

Here are our 2025 end of year Bullying Survey results. While we are pleased to see **a reduction in bullying at school**, there is a concerning upward trend in **cyber-bullying using devices at home**.

To support our families in navigating this digital landscape, we have partnered with **Rob Cope for a 'Kids Online' parent evening**.
