Staffing Update

We are delighted to announce that Mrs Laura Treeby has been appointed as the new teacher for Room 17, beginning the start of Term 2. Many of you will already know Laura as a familiar face around our school. We are thrilled to have her step into this role; her strengths and existing relationships within our community will ensure a seamless transition and continued success for all our students.

Homework

This Friday, students will bring home an example of what homework may look like for them this year. This is intended to give families a clear idea of the types of tasks students can work on at home to support their learning. (Rimu homework will go home on Monday due to their trip on Friday).

With the sample, will be a return slip for parents to indicate whether they would like their child to continue receiving weekly homework or if they'd prefer to opt out. If families choose to take part in the regular homework opportunities, students will need to return their homework books or folders each week in order to receive the next activity.

As participation is intended to be flexible and family led, teachers won't be chasing up homework. We hope this approach provides a simple way for families who would like extra learning opportunities at home to take part, while also allowing others to opt out if it better suits their routines.

Over the summer Quinn (Yr 6) represented Titahi Bay Surf Lifesaving Club in a number of Surf Lifesaving carnivals

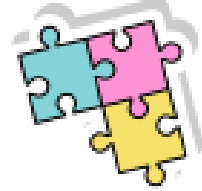
Quinn

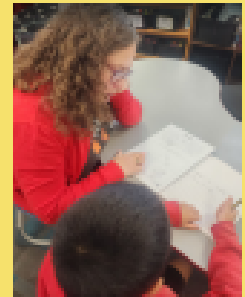

EVER WONDERED WHY YOUR CHILD IS EXHAUSTED WHEN THEY COME HOME FROM SCHOOL?

8.55am - 9.10am Children participate in a mat time hui which can involve te reo, karakia and waiata. Next, we launch into a literacy mat time which involves handwriting, phonics and spelling.



9.30 - 10.30am Children engage in both teacher directed and student led activities of literacy or mathematics. During this time, the teacher calls small groups of children to the 'jellybean' table for learning.



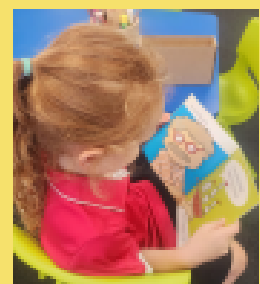
10.25am - 10.50am Morning tea

10.50am - 1.00pm In Year 0-1, children begin their Learning Through Play collaboration time, where teachers promote and coach targeted areas of our Adventure Way traits. During this time teachers take both whole class and small groups of children for mathematics or literacy teaching. This is also when students take part in dictated, guided or independent writing.



1.00pm - 1.55pm Lunch Time

1.55pm - 3.00pm Our afternoons in Kōwhai are the most varied part of the day. They are made up of physical education (PE), buddy class time, library, assembly, the Arts, or preschool visits (where applicable).

Picking up or dropping off kids at school? Always park safely

Everyone's "only here for a minute" but where and how you park matters – our tamariki can't be seen by drivers if we park illegally.

Common parking restrictions

Parking restrictions are in place to help keep everyone safe and keep traffic flowing.



The safest drop-off/pick-up place outside most schools. Stop here for no longer than two minutes.

This sign shows the times when parking is restricted.



You must not stop, pull over, or park at anytime at a marked bus stop.



Park in a way that does not cover the footpath or berm.



Mobility parks are only for those with a mobility parking permit on display.



You must leave at least a one metre gap between your car and any driveway.



Parking or pulling over onto broken yellow lines is restricted, even if you remain in the car.

Safer school runs

If you're stopping and parking near a school, choose safe parking every time.

Drivers and children need good visibility around schools so they can see each other. Parking restrictions are in place near schools for a reason – to protect our tamariki from danger.

If you choose to stop or park illegally you could get fined.

Stopped/parked:

• on broken yellow lines	\$100
• within 6 metres of a pedestrian crossing	\$100
• within 6 metres of an intersection	\$100
• on the footpath	\$70
• over or within 1 metre of a vehicle entrance	\$70
• within 50cm of a fire hydrant with no one in a car legally capable of moving it	\$70
• closer than 6 metres to a bus stop or on a marked bus stop	\$70
• on roadside grass plot, shrubs or flower beds	\$70
• double parked	\$70
• in an area reserved for disabled persons	\$750
